SWIMMING LESSONS



Physical education has never been so "wet" at LFIM! Indeed, our students from 4^{th} to 12^{th} grade go once or twice a week, depending on their schedule, to the Urmi Estate swimming-pool.

Thomas Audic, our sports teacher, has planned aquatic games as well as freestyle and endurance exercises for the semester.

For the 4th and 5th grade students, games have been introduced to make them feel comfortable in the water and to enable them to move around freely.

6th grade onwards, training is essentially based on resistance and endurance, with students swimming continuously for 6 to 12 minutes, depending on their age.

On Friday, 20th September, we had the pleasure of welcoming the French Ambassador, Mr Emmanuel Lenain, who, having just arrived in India, honoured us with a visit.
