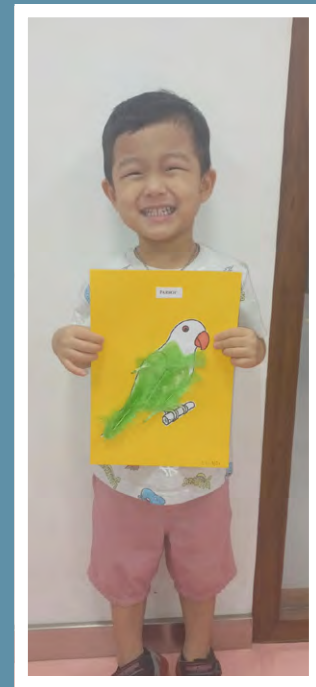
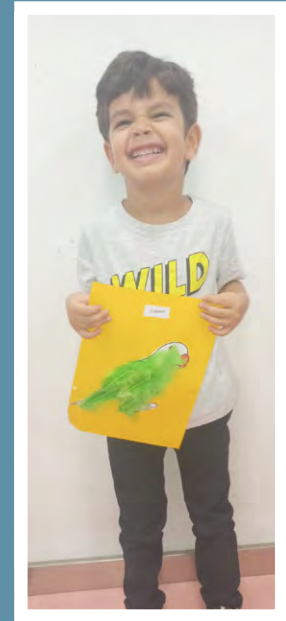
LIGHT AS A FEATHER

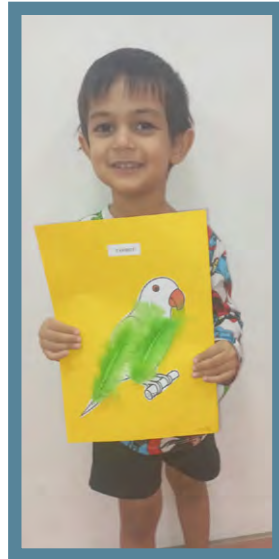
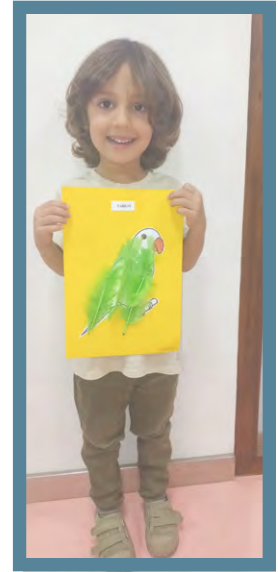
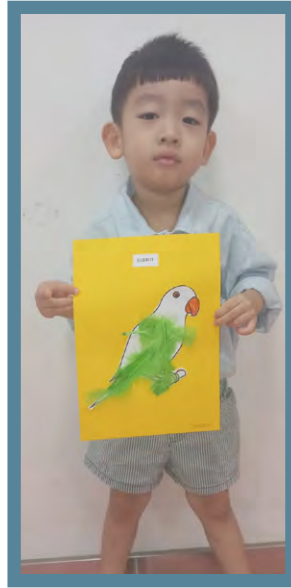
Students of PS1 worked with feathers as part of their lessons on birds and animals.
